Last night, in conjunction with the opening of the Paralympics in Tokyo next week, **#WeThe 15** launched a huge, decade-long, truly international campaign aimed at putting disability at the center of the inclusivity agenda.




#WeThe 15 (which represents the fact that people with disabilities make up 15% of the world's population) is a coalition of 20 organizations, including UN Human Rights, UNESCO, and Special Olympics, and spearheaded by the International Paralympic Committee (IPC) and the International Disability Alliance. Last night's launch featured 125 global landmarks across six continents—including the Empire State Building, Niagara Falls, the London Eye, the Colosseum and the world's tallest tower, Skytree in Tokyo—lit up in purple, representing the international color of disability, and demonstrating cross-border solidarity among people with disabilities, wherever they live.
