

# Giving & Getting: SDMNY Partners with the Hunter College Silberman School of Social Work



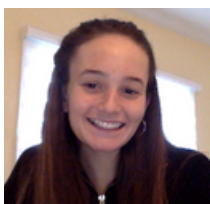

Like our Decision-Makers, Hunter and CUNY itself, our Social Work School partners are as diverse as the city we call home. Here are a few:



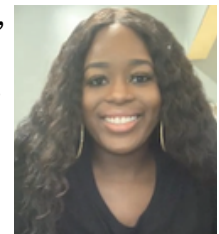

Komla is an immigrant from Togo, in West Africa, who worked at a provider organization, S:US, before starting his MSW program, and is a proud graduate of the class of 2020. He works with Paul, an older gentleman who hopes to start his own business.



Rosie graduated from the BSW program (where she began working with SDMNY) and is now pursuing her MSW, also at Hunter. She works with Jayden, a transition age student.

Tanisha is an immigrant from Jamaica, the mother of a two-year old, and, like Komla, an August graduate of the MSW program. Tanisha is working with Raven, a self-advocate. Tanisha says that it has been her "honor to be part of the SDMNY project since October, 2019" because of SDMNY's "collective effort, supportive environment and commitment to our Decision-Makers 'maximizing their autonomy'".
